I am a Roman Catholic Permanent Deacon in the Diocese of Westminster and a retired academic who has served as a Lecturer, Senior Lecturer and Principal Lecturer in Theology and Religious Studies at Saint Mary's University (formerly Saint Mary's University College), Twickenham, for 33 years, and subsequently as a Senior Research Fellow at University of Wales Lampeter and again as a Visiting Lecturer and Senior Research Fellow at St Mary's University, Twickenham.

In 1982, I became a founder member of the Living Stones of the Holy Land Trust, a registered ecumenical charity set up to promote links between Christians in Britain and Christians in the Holy Land and neighbouring countries. Patrons of this charity have included, three Anglican Bishops, three Roman Catholic Cardinals, an Anglican Archbishop of York, two Latin Patriarchs, one Greek Catholic Patriarch, two Greek Orthodox bishops and a President of the Lutheran World Federation.

My work for Living Stones and involvement in leading Holy Land Pilgrimages soon brought me into contact with Dr. Sizer, whose academic expertise and strong advocacy of human rights provided very valuable support to the development of the charity and its work.

I am proud to have worked with Dr. Sizer over more than more than four decades. I know him well, and I find the accusation of anti-Semitism against him to be risible.

He is utterly opposed to racism or sectarianism of any kind, and I believe that he is yet one more victim of a politically motivated campaign to conflate criticism of Israel or of Zionist ideology with hatred or negative prejudice against Jews.

I also know that he has the support of a number of Jewish rabbis, academics and Jewish human rights campaigners who share his commendable concern for the plight of the Palestinian people.
