At times I have agreed with Stephen, at times not, but he has always helped me to think more clearly about complex issues, and I have never doubted his Christian integrity. And I shall always be grateful for the support we received from Stephen in South America days, as well as more recently as we have sought to adapt back to contemporary Britain.

I find it extraordinary therefore, that Stephen is being called to account yet again by the Board of Deputies. There is, to my mind, a huge difference between being critical of a particular government and its policies and a deep concern, even love of the nation over which that government exercises authority.

For many years, as you know, we lived under successive military dictatorships both in Argentina and Paraguay and were sometimes in conflict with those who ruled over us. It wasn't always comfortable, especially during the Falklands war and under Stroessner in Paraguay.

Yet I was never in any doubt that those whose policies we disagreed with, understood that our love and respect for the Argentine nation, and the Paraguayan nation was genuine and heartfelt.

You will see the parallels I am making and the implications; being critical of a government, (more so when it is seeking to be democratic), and loving the people it represents, are by no means incompatible.

So I am shocked that this is happening all over again, and particularly concerned about the huge stress levels being placed on Stephen and Joanna.
